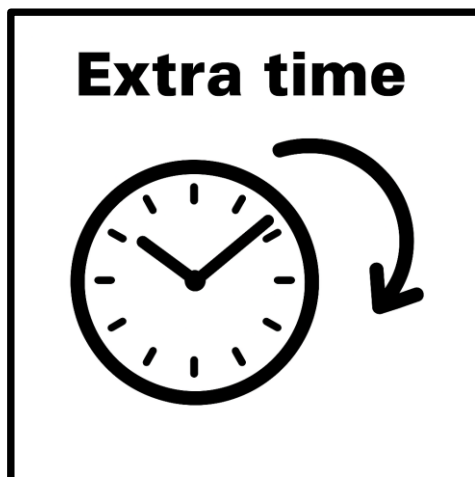
Members will get:

The **Disability Commissioner** is an independent person who protects the rights of people with disability in Tasmania.



The **Minister for Disability Services** the Hon. Jo Palmer MLC is a government leader who makes decisions and is responsible for disability services. She is referred to as the **Minister**.



The **Disability Inclusion Advisory Council** is the Council that advises the **Minister** and the **Disability Commissioner**.

It is sometimes referred to as “the Council”.
